## **American Red Cross Offers First Aid and CPR/AED Courses in Faribault in February**

**Learn to save lives!**

**Faribault, MN, January 23, 2012** — Would you know what to do in an emergency? Each year, more than 5 million people learn how to save a life in American Red Cross training classes. People in Faribault can join the ranks of these everyday heroes by taking a class now.

The Red Cross of Rice/LeSueur/Waseca Counties is offering the following courses:

**Wed. Feb. 7—CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer and Healthcare Provider**, 6p-9p, W 6pm-9pm, \$110— This course trains professional-level rescuers and healthcare workers to respond to breathing and cardiac emergencies in adults, children and infants until more advanced medical personnel take over.

**Thurs. Feb. 9—CPR/AED for the Professional Rescuer and Healthcare Provider Review**, 5pm-9:30pm , \$90— An abbreviated CPR/AED for Professional Rescuers and Healthcare Providers course that briefly reviews course information and allows practice of skills before testing. To be eligible to participate in a review course, participants must have successfully completed prior training. This training can be verified with an American Red Cross Certificate or equivalent.

**Tues. Feb. 14—Pediatric CPR/AED Review**, 6pm-9pm, \$55— An abbreviated Pediatric CPR/AED course that briefly reviews course information and allows practice of skills and knowledge before testing.

**Wed. Feb. 15—Adult CPR/AED**, 6pm-9pm , \$70—This course will help participants recognize and respond appropriately to cardiac and breathing emergencies. The course teaches the skills that participants need to know to give immediate care to a suddenly injured or ill person until more advanced medical personnel arrive and take over.

**Mon. Feb. 20—Pediatric First Aid/CPR/AED**, 6pm-8:30pm, \$90—These courses will help participants recognize and respond appropriately to first aid emergencies and cardiac and breathing emergencies in infants and children. The courses teach skills that participants need to know to give immediate care to a suddenly injured or ill person until more advanced medical personnel arrive and take over.

**Wed. Feb. 22—Adult CPR/AED Review**, 6pm-8:30pm, \$55— An abbreviated Adult CPR/AED course that briefly reviews course information and allows practice of skills and knowledge before testing.

**Thur. Feb. 23—First Aid**, 6pm-9pm , \$70— This course will help participants recognize and respond appropriately to first aid emergencies. The courses in the program teach skills that participants need to know to give immediate care to a suddenly injured or ill person until more advanced medical personnel arrive and take over.

**Wed. Feb. 29—Adult and Pediatric CPR/AED Review**, 6pm-9pm, \$70— An abbreviated Adult and Pediatric CPR/AED course that briefly reviews course information and allows practice of skills and knowledge before testing.

All classes are held at the chapter building at 408 Central Avenue North, Suite B in Faribault. Certifications for the courses are valid for two years unless otherwise noted. Early registration is highly encouraged, as a class may be cancelled if there is no enrollment a week prior to the date of the class.
